

## Memorandum

Subject: Court Debtor Electronic Noticing July 20, 2018

- 1. A few years ago, our court implemented the national Debtor Electronic Bankruptcy Noticing (DeBN) system in order for your debtor clients to receive court-generated bankruptcy notices in bankruptcy cases. Many of your clients have signed up for the program and receive court-generated bankruptcy notices in their cases. As an attorney registered in CM/ECF, you automatically receive electronic notifications of all filings in your bankruptcy cases and adversary proceedings.
- 2. Our court is changing from the DeBN system to a court-sponsored notification system (Debtor Electronic Noticing) which will allow your client to receive electronic notice of ANY filing made in your client's case, *not just court-generated notices*. Also, it will allow your client to have multiple email addresses, not just one email address.
- 3. From the court's perspective, we will be better able to manage electronic noticing if there are email bounce-backs or other problems surrounding email addresses. We hope you take advantage of this new system, which is provided as a service to your client(s) free of charge.
- 4. If your debtor client is currently using DeBN and has an open case, he or she will receive a letter from our office notifying him or her of the change. We will also give the debtor the opportunity to fill out the appropriate form and return it to our office. We encourage you to check with your client to ensure that he or she has completed the process.
- 5. We will begin mailing notification to current DeBN users on August 8 and will go live with our new system on August 17. We anticipate all current DeBN users to be migrated to the new system on or about August 31. I have attached the previously mentioned form to this email. The form will also be published on our website. If your client wishes to continue to receive electronic notices, please fill out the form and return it to our office at the address indicated on the form.
