Orders on Motions to Avoid Lien

The judges of this court would like to make a language change in all future Orders on Motions to Avoid Lien in order to conform more thoroughly with the Bankruptcy Code.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the motion to avoid lien of the debtor(s) is hereby Granted. The court avoids the fixing of the judicial lien on the real and personal property of the debtor, upon the entry of the discharge in this case. subject to reinstatement under 11 USC § 349 upon dismissal of the case.

Motion to Reopen Case to File FMCC

The judges of this court have approved the below procedure change:

For all Motions to Reopen Case for the sole purpose of filing the Financial Management Course Certificate, no notice shall be required. You should upload an order for the judge's review at the time you file your Motion. Additionally, service upon the Trustee is the only service requirement when filing a Motion to Reopen Case.

Pacer Newsletter and NextGen CM/ECF

The court is aware that the PACER Service Center (PSC), in its January 2016 Newsletter, offered tips, suggestions, and a host of other useful information regarding the nation's District, Appellate, and Bankruptcy Courts conversion to the Next Generation (NextGen) of CM/ECF. While the Middle District of Georgia Bankruptcy Court will also eventually convert to NextGen, no date has yet been set for this event. Please know that all attorneys, other registered filers, and others having business with the court will be given several months advance notice of the conversion along with other information that is compatible and in addition to the informative PSC Newsletter.

Change of Event Name

To more closely reflect the procedures provided by LBR 4001-1(e), a CM/ECF motions event name has been changed from "Approval of Loan Modification" to "Loan Negotiations (LBR 4001-1(e)" and no longer prompts for an objections deadline or hearing date.
