## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER #139 REQUIRING TELEPHONIC HEARINGS IN COLUMBUS DIVISION AND MACON DIVISION CASES

Due to the ongoing pandemic and in furtherance of our efforts toward the safety of parties, attorneys, and court staff, and because it appears that most attorneys at present prefer, when possible, to have hearings handled telephonically, the following procedures will apply in all cases pending in the Columbus Division and the Macon Division of this Court. For so long as this Order is in effect, it will replace Administrative Order #137 (re: mass calendars) with respect to cases pending in the Columbus Division and Macon Divisions.

Beginning the date of this Order and until further notice by the Court, inperson appearances by counsel, parties, and witnesses will not be allowed, absent permission from the assigned judge; hearings will be handled telephonically as described below. If counsel believes a particular matter requires in-person appearances, he or she may seek guidance from the Court by contacting the assigned judge's courtroom deputy at the number or e-mail address listed below. Each judge will manage his own docket, so the procedures may not necessarily be the same. Each judge's courtroom deputy will notify counsel and unrepresented parties of any changes to the scheduling of trials, evidentiary hearings, and other matters on a case-by-case basis. Questions should be directed to the courtroom deputies or the Clerk's Office.

## **Telephonic Hearing Call-In Instructions:**

The Court will continue to use the AT&T Reservationless Conference Call System, which is free of charge to all parties. Dial-in procedures and the toll-free numbers for the judges are as follows:

- 1. Dial the appropriate toll-free number as listed below.
- 2. Enter the access code associated with the toll-free number.
- 3. Dial in at least 5 minutes before your scheduled hearing time.
- 4. Place all phones on mute when your case is not being heard. Do not use the "speaker" function. Do not place the call on hold.
- 5. Users are prohibited from recording or broadcasting the proceedings conducted by the Court.
